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INTRO....

The Roman blind, sometimes called the folded blind, is the most popular way to dress your windows, and for good reason.

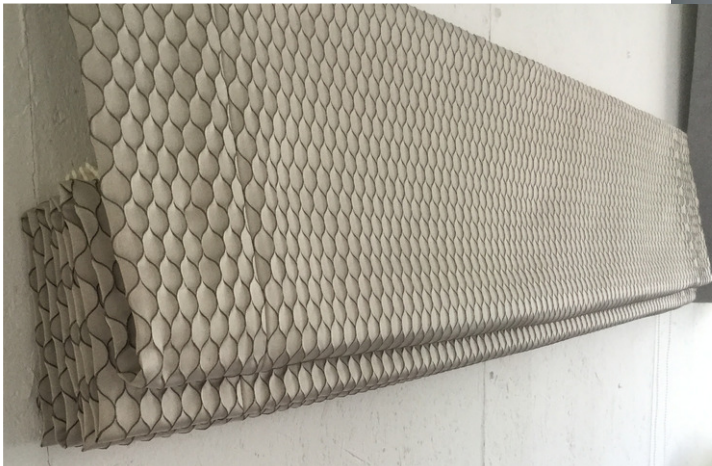
Roman blinds, when made well, are very stylish and neat. They are a great way of showing off fabric.

If you have chosen a fabric with any pattern, you need to ensure that there is careful pattern placement along the top of the blind.



PLEAT POSITIONS

Roman blinds folds can be either be straight pleats or cascade/step placements.



Even when you use straight pleats, the majority of the time most people do not pull the blind all the way up, allowing the top fold to be shown slightly pleated.



BORDERS AND PELMETS

The use of pelmets along the top of the blind, or the use of borders allows you to frame your fabrics.



With this blind the pleats are straight with a bottom flap. The flap is a border of a contrast fabric - in this case a bright yellow to add a bit of zing!



TRIMMINGS

And finally, why not add a trim along the bottom of your roman blinds?

You can add drama with a pom pom trim, and sparkle with beads.
